Over the years, Little Stone Church has enjoyed the service of many distinguished ministers. Our present Pastor is Reverend Dr. Dan Hans. Reverend Hans graduated from Denison University (Ohio), where he captained his college lacrosse team, was selected to the All-American Lacrosse Team, and received an NCAA post-graduate scholarship for athletics, academics, and leadership. Planning to go into medicine, he shifted into the ministry due to his experiences on the college staff of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes. He received his Masters of Divinity degree from Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary (MA) and his Doctor of Ministry degree from

Pittsburgh Theological Seminary. Ordained in the Presbyterian Church USA, he served as Assistant Pastor at First Presbyterian Church, Pittsburgh, PA, Campus Pastor at Duquesne University, Pittsburgh, Pastor of United Presbyterian Church, Milford, CT, Senior Pastor / Head of Staff at Gettysburg Presbyterian Church, Gettysburg, PA and Senior Pastor / Head of Staff at Second Presbyterian Church, Lexington, KY.

Additional Christian service includes: Mission work behind the Iron Curtain in Eastern Europe; Adams County, PA Habitat for Humanity Board of Directors for 20 years; and Co-Director of an annual Medical/Dental Mission Project in Honduras for 20 years. He served on the Board of Directors of the Lincoln Fellowship of Pennsylvania for 10 years.
